23	appreciate that. Thank you for allowing me to come to
24	your meeting today and, first, I just want to start



off and say congratulations on your award. It's really great to see everything Chicago Southland is doing and you guys being such an important part of it to make the Southland great. That's one of my goals as a commissioner. I'm one of the few commissioners that represents only the South and Southwest suburbs, so I have no city of Chicago. So whenever anybody says "the city," I'm, like, which one, so -- because there's many cities that are "the city" and so congratulations.

As you might know, I share this district with Commissioner Daley so he sends his acknowledgement as well. He'll see you guys tomorrow at the groundbreaking ceremony. Unfortunately, I can't attend that, but thank you for the invitation, but great job on everything that's happening here in the Village of Bedford Park. And I just wanted to come before you today to just talk about the good news about the investments, I'm sure you guys are already aware of all those, but I like to go and talk about CDBG and Invest in Cook money that comes out to all the different municipalities.

As you may know, there's been \$8.5 million in the Invest in Cook Program and that covers the cost



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of planning and feasibility, engineering, right of way acquisition and construction associated with transportation, improvements sponsored by local and regional government and private partners. Program is designed to solicit applications for the improvements consistent with the five priorities and the connecting Cook County which is the County's long-range transportation plan which we heard more of As you guys might have heard, we passed our -well, we heard our employmentary (phonetic) budget today and it's going to be the biggest budget ever, \$9.2 billion for the County. So all of these different priorities and strategic objectives align with the priorities that the County has outlined and this is one of them, the transportation plan.

So in my capacity as the commissioner in the 6th District, I focus not only on just my district, but all of Cook County and the Southland as a region and we have county government investments that are super important and the services and programs which the County has jurisdiction over. So this good news that you all have already been aware of about the ARPA funded Invest in Cook money which you were awarded \$1.2 million to construct a new separated



storm sewer to address the local residential structure 1 2 flooding along the adjacent 71st Street ditch. this has been a project long time coming and it's been 3 combined sewer district areas and in partnership with 4 MWRD which will be the lead agency on this project. 5 So thanks for allowing me to address you. 6 We do monitor all of these programs especially the ones that show connectivity in the Southland. 8 9 thank you. 10 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: We thank you and your 11 fellow board members. The Ride to Work Program -- and 12 Joe kind of administrates that for us, but it's 13 been -- it's helped a lot of people and there's some 14 ways to expand on it and I think that's going to even 15 help more --16 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Absolutely. 17 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: -- so we're 18 appreciative of that. 19 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Well, thank you to all of 20 you. 21 (Round of applause.) There's been some issues too 20 over there with Cintas. So I think we have good 21 justifications with the adult entertainment center to 22 be denied. Magoos got it before. I talked to him. 23 He said, well, it's not a life or death thing. 24 don't know what people want to do.



TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Why do they need to be open 1 2 till 4:00 o'clock. 3 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Because they make more 4 money. TRUSTEE PALLARDY: Because that Wednesday the 5 6 college kids are home. TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Black Wednesday is all college kids are back. 8 9 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: If we've done it in the past, 10 we've had no issues. Tom, what are your thoughts on 11 it? 12 I'm against it. All it is it's CHIEF HANSEN: just more problems, you know, our experience at 13 14 We just went to 2:00 a.m. across the board 4:00 a.m. 15 at all the other places in town and I know that Fever 16 just got hit with a violation; but it's -- you know, 17 after six months they'll be in line next and you did 18 it for them, what about us now. I just think it's 19 more -- just a lot of problems and it takes all of our 20 resources from one area to that area when there's 21 stuff going on. 22 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. 23 TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Listen to the Chief. 24 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Everybody okay with



the (indicating) --1 2 (Chorus of yeses.) VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: We don't need a motion. 3 And, Tom, could you go over the incident 4 5 that happened at the hotel? The other one -- The 14 one that went 67th ended up -- Chicago started chasing 15 them, we went over there to Chicago and they ended up 16 losing them; but the vehicle crashed at 67th and 17 Damen. There -- This is just another incident like 18 19 this and they're going on, you know, all over the 20 They're armed. They don't care. Chicagoland area. Ι 21 mean, they went to ram one of our squad cars at 22 one point. They don't - They're going to get away. 23 It's not their property. The car that they had 24 crashed out was used in an armed robbery in Cicero



probably about 45 minutes before the incident in our town.

It's, you know, just an ongoing problem that, you know, law enforcement is working on, but it's just a difficult thing because there's just no care for the law at this point from certain individuals.

TRUSTEE STOCKS: When they ram a squad car, is that considered an assault with a weapon?

CHIEF HANSEN: It's an aggravated battery so that would be a felony; but, like, when -- If they have their intention of trying to ram us, we're going to move, you know, like, again, it's -- we don't know what happened after that ramming. You know, does it go off and hit somebody else, you know? So we're going to try -- Unless there's -- they're actively trying to get somebody else and we have to get in their way, at that point it's property over lives -- you know, like, lives over property, I should say. So we can't say, Hey, we're going to stop them because they were breaking into a car with what amounts to deadly force by not getting out of their way.
