16 MS. FAVELA: I do. At the last meeting, I sent  
17 the request for the donation. I don't know if you  
18 received it.

19 VILLAGE CLERK ZAVALA: (Nodding.)

20 MS. FAVELA: Okay.

21 VILLAGE CLERK ZAVALA: I'll talk to you after.

22 MS. FAVELA: Okay.

23 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Sandy ...

24 MS. SHEEHAN: Yes. Okay. I'll be reviewing the

1 December 2023 Month-End Board Report that Marilyn has  
2 prepared. To begin, the Cash Balances at the end of  
3 December were \$92.6 million compared with November's  
4 ending balance of \$89 million which was an overall  
5 increase of cash by approximately 2.6 million.

6 The General Fund Revenues year to date  
7 through December was 50.8 million which has exceeded  
8 the Annual Budget by 10 percent.

9 Here are just some of the highlights  
10 related to revenue. Real Estate Tax Revenue is at  
11 \$16.6 million year to date. This is due to the timing  
12 of property tax bills from the County.

13 As of year end, 93 percent of the 2022 levy  
14 has been collected leaving about 1 million still to be  
15 collected in 2024.

16 Reimbursed Ambulance Fees were 807,000 for  
17 2023 which was 470,000 over the expected Budgeted  
18 Amount. This was due to the GEMT Program enrolled in  
19 by Chief Johnson.

20 Another significant outlier was Interest  
21 Income. For 2023, there has been \$775,000 received  
22 for interest. The budget was 242,000. The majority  
23 of this revenue was earned in the last quarter of 2023  
24 due to the movement of the Corporate Cash Funds from a

1 Wintrust checking account to a money market back in  
2 September.

3 General Fund Expenditures year to date  
4 through December were \$43 million which exceeds the  
5 year end within -- which ends the year within  
6 1 percent of the budget plan.

7 The Water Revenue for 2023 was 43 million  
8 and it was just over the estimated budget. Water  
9 Revenue Expenditures were 46.4 million which was  
10 consistent with the budgeted amount.

11 The Event Center as reported by FSM, the  
12 Event Center in December 2023 Operational Revenue was  
13 211,000 with 250,000 of expense resulting in a net  
14 operating loss of approximately 39,000 for the month.  
15 The year to date net -- or 2023 year-end losses is  
16 approximately 312,000 for the facility at an  
17 operational level which ended up being 372,000 better  
18 than the original budgeted loss of 684.

19 And that summarizes the 2023 December  
20 Report.

21 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. We'll recommend  
22 to John that you received a very good pay raise.

23 MS. SHEEHAN: Thank you. Thank you.

24 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Can we have a motion

1 and second to approve the Accountant's Report?

2 TRUSTEE STOCKS: So moved.

3 TRUSTEE MALOY: Second.

4 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: I just have a question. I  
5 notice there was a reduction in Gaming Revenue and I'm  
6 just curious if we have any idea if that's just -- you  
7 know, people are gambling less or what's going on?

8 MS. CURNUTTE: I think in general there's more  
9 machines, more places for them to go to.

10 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: Got it. Okay. That's it.  
11 Thank you.

12 MR. RONOVSKY: And, John, we don't have a lot of  
13 regulars. We don't have a lot of regulars just  
14 because of the infrequency of who's coming through  
15 there. So it's not, like, you're going in there over  
16 and over.

17 MS. CURNUTTE: And it's 5 percent for all of  
18 the --

19 MR. RONOVSKY: Sorry. I was talking -- I was  
20 thinking about the six machines I worry about. Okay.

21 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: The increase is down  
22 because we've had a full year of the numbers that was  
23 involved.

24 MS. CURNUTTE: It was down 3 percent from last

1 year.

2 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: Okay. Thank you.

3 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. The attorney's  
4 request will do in a couple minutes.

5 Trustee Maloy ...

6 TRUSTEE MALOY: Thank you, Mayor. I have  
7 one bill in the claims list to be approved since the  
8 last meeting. It was processed on February 15, 2024,  
9 in the amount of \$3,871,959.22. There's one payroll

12 bills, claims and payroll expenses to be approved is  
13 \$4,408,351.66. I'd like to request a motion that all

24 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: So anything else, Rory?

1 MR. DOSS: No. Everything is going good. Thank  
2 you.

3 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Chris ...

4 MR. LESNIAK: Everything is good. We're  
5 continuing on with our projects. I meet with the City  
6 of Chicago on March 12th and they're supposed to give  
7 us the number as far as if they're going to increase  
8 our rate by 2, 3, 4 or 5 percent; so hopefully they  
9 give us that number. And I heard American Water and  
10 Aqua also are raising their rates. So I know it's  
11 nothing to do with us, but I just heard that on the  
12 news yesterday.

13 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: It's going to have  
14 something to do with us eventually. Does he have  
15 another meeting, like, the 21st of March or something?

16 MR. LESNIAK: 12th, just the 12th, yeah. We  
17 have that meeting the 21st about the --

18 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: So we'll get the rate  
19 at that meeting then?

20 MR. LESNIAK: Not the rate, it's the increase.  
21 The yearly increase that they give us in June, he said  
22 we should know that increase. So not great news, but  
23 yeah.

24 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Good. Dan ...

1 CHIEF JOHNSON: Everything is going well, Mayor.  
2 Just an update on personnel, we only have one vacancy  
3 left, we're working on filling that. We had an  
4 interview today. We're moving one more candidate into  
5 his final testing phases and hopefully we'll be at  
6 full staff real soon. So thank you.

7 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Good. Tom ...

8 CHIEF HANSEN: Couple things. The -- We're  
9 seeing in the 8th district more of the street  
10 gatherings where they're taking over intersections.  
11 About two weeks ago, they were at 63rd and Central and  
12 they've also been at 63rd and Narragansett where  
13 there -- a bunch of cars are just closing off the  
14 intersections and doing the -- all the different  
15 tricks and stuff like that.

16 The -- They're tough things to handle.  
17 Chicago, they're under orders, basically. They won't  
18 approach until they have enough personnel to really  
19 close it off because if a few cops walk in there,  
20 they're just going to start throwing bottles,  
21 fireworks. They'll do whatever and they'll drive  
22 their cars at them. So it's a tough problem. So  
23 we're trying to keep them just out of our town  
24 completely.

1                   One of the things we were doing, we just --  
2                   One of the officers shut the gates because 63rd and  
3                   Central was getting closed down just at the Event  
4                   Center just to make sure they didn't make it into our  
5                   parking lot. So now we're working on with Joe and  
6                   trying to figure out a time, like, maybe on the  
7                   weekends just to shut the gates at the end of the  
8                   night or something just to keep it going because  
9                   they're seeing a lot on Friday and Saturday night at  
10                  this point.

11                  The other thing is we've been having weekly  
12                  meetings regarding the Save Gaza protests that have  
13                  been going on throughout the area. They're  
14                  typically -- On our end, they're originating in  
15                  Bridgeview and then -- The goal of where they want to  
16                  go isn't known because they don't really want to share  
17                  with law enforcement where they're going. It seems to  
18                  be they want to go downtown and Chicago doesn't want  
19                  that, obviously, because, you know, they're afraid  
20                  that they -- They want to just cause problems with  
21                  traffic just to send a message, they want -- They want  
22                  to be on the news. Another concern is they're going  
23                  to try and shut down Cicero, like Midway Airport, just  
24                  to basically have a bunch of cars and just shut --

1 because that -- the more news they get, the more  
2 attention they get. That's kind of what they're doing  
3 to bring attention to their issues. So we're having  
4 weekly meetings with that and, you know, just kind of  
5 right now we don't get a lot of information when it's  
6 happening. When it does, we're cooperating with  
7 Chicago and our other suburbs just trying to work  
8 together to make sure that we have a plan for -- if  
9 they do stop or if they try to shut something down how  
10 we're going to react and -- So that's just what it is  
11 at this point. There's not much warning that we're  
12 getting. They're just coming and then they just go  
13 whatever direction they want to go. So that's where  
14 we're at with that.

15 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: And with that, I'd like  
16 to poll the Board to -- at least we've seen a lot of  
17 the protesters have gone to village board meetings.  
18 Orland had a big situation. Talking with Larry and,  
19 you know, I would recommend that our stand be that  
20 it's a federal issue and as a municipality -- because  
21 they're asking the towns to pass ordinance -- or  
22 proclamations calling for a cease fire in Gaza, not  
23 saying, you know, release the hostages or anything.  
24 They're saying a cease fire, and it's a federal issue



1 and I would -- If it does come up here, I would hope  
2 that's the stand that we can take.

3 CHIEF HANSEN: At another suburb, they did have  
4 to shut down the meeting, basically, and then, you  
5 know, clear everyone out because, you know --

6 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Disruption.

7 CHIEF HANSEN: It's an emotional topic. There  
8 are high emotions on both sides and -- so ...

9 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: But it's federal.

10 Okay. There's no executive session.  
11 Things have been peaceful. I did handle that one pay  
12 raise. That was an interesting situation, but it's  
13 done.

14 So can we have a motion -- Anything else  
15 from anybody?

16 Can we have a motion and a second adjourn?

17 TRUSTEE STOCKS: So moved.

18 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: Second.

19 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. All those in  
20 favor?

21 (Chorus of ayes.)

22 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay.

23 (Which were all the proceedings  
24 had in the above-entitled cause.)
