13	was harmless so far. You know, there were a couple of
14	bumps in the road but nothing bad
15	TRUSTEE STOCKS: Are these two
16	VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: but it
17	TRUSTEE STOCKS: Are these broken down or they're

There is one change, and 1 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: 2. I don't think it's a bad change. 3 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Everyone got a copy? TRUSTEE STOCKS: 4 Yeah. Okay. 5 TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: I'm good. 6 TRUSTEE STOCKS: All right. Yeah. VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Do you want me to go over it, Dave? 8 9 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: 10 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Yeah. This is the 11 proposed Memo of Understanding between us and the Sky, a 12 lot of whereas, we call them preambles, but basically, 13 like we said before, we'll build 125,000-square foot 14 facility called the project. The anticipated cost is 15 \$32 million. Architectural drawings have been submitted 16 and reviewed by us and by the Sky. 17 The Sky has requested roughly 18 43,000 square feet to be built on their behalf. 19 portion of the facility would be designated as the Sky's 20 practice facility. 21 The practice facility would include two 22 full length basketball courts, a training room, player's 23 lounge, administrative offices that will cover -- will 24 cover approximately 37,000 square feet. The remaining



6,000 square feet will be available to the Sky to lease 1 2. or rent out to third-parties. A copy of a preliminary layout is 3 attached as Exhibit A. That's what it's going to look 4 5 like hopefully. This is what Steve has done. The Sky 6 has approved it. It's the very last page. TRUSTEE STOCKS: Very last? VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Yes, please. 8 9 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Okav. 10 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Okay? 11 TRUSTEE STOCKS: All right. 12 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Revenue derived from the leasing of the 6,000 square feet will be distributed 13 14 as follows: 66 percent to the Sky and 33 percent to the 15 Village. 16 We're going use the money as we deem appropriate, whether it be for a maintenance fund, 17 18 whether it be for repairs. It won't be described as 19 rent but we'll use it what we think is proper, and they 20 had no problem with that. 21 Page 3 is where you get down to the nuts 22 and bolts. The Sky has agreed to submit \$5.9 million to 23 the Village as follows: \$1,500,000 will be placed in escrow at the time the Village completes its financing 24



of the \$25 million. We're anticipated September 15th. 1 2. TRUSTEE STOCKS: Okay. That's the date of 3 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: the bond closing. Right now everything is going good. 4 5 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Good. VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: The remaining 6 7 \$4,400,000 will be deposited within 180 days of the initial deposit. So that's good timing for us, because 8 9 remember, we need all that money. Steve is going to 10 have this built hopefully within a year. 11 TRUSTEE STOCKS: About a year. 12 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: So we need this --13 need that money. We'll put the money in escrow. We 14 don't want to hold it. They don't want to hold it. we'll have an escrow agent and with escrow instructions. 15 16 The agent can be a title company, it could be a bank, 17 but you never want to get an escrow agent if you don't 18 have to. 19 Draw downs, \$25 million, they want us to 20 use our money first which gives them a little more time 21 to get their financing, but, again, they've committed, 22 you know, to get it to us within 180 days from the 23 initial deposit. 24 This will be a ten-year time period.



They've asked to -- ability to renew it for another ten 1 2 years, and we said yes, but we got to approve the third-party. And secondarily, if it is renewed, we're 3 not sure we want to spend the \$250,000 every year for 4 5 advertising. So we got to do that for the first ten 6 years, but if they go --TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Mm-hmm. TRUSTEE STOCKS: Yeah. 8 9 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: -- the next the ten 10 years, we'll revisit that issue. Construction, the Village would use its 11 12 best faith efforts to complete the facility on or before 13 October 1st, 2025, subject to acts of God, material, 14 labor, and shortages and any other event beyond the 15 control of the Village, such as COVID. 16 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Yeah. 17 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: That was a -- People 18 have taken a beating on that and the Courts have ruled 19 usually against the contractors. So -- But we'll give 20 them monthly updates. They'll be invited to every 21 meeting that Steve has -- excuse me -- with Tom and 22 Concord. So they'll be receiving all of the drawings, 23 and they'll be advised of what's going on. 24 Advertising, this is what we agreed upon:



We'll spend \$250,000 per year advertising or promoting 1 2. This obligation, again, will only be in effect for the first ten years. If they do renew after ten, 3 again, we can talk about it. Hopefully, they do, 4 5 but ... Parking, this was one of the issues. 6 We 7 said we'll give them 30 parking spaces for the Sky. We'll install a gate and it can be operated by a fob, 8 9 and it will be given to the Sky for distribution. they want -- You know, their facility is, what, Archer 10 11 and Michigan or whatever downtown. 12 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Yeah. 13 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: They want to be able 14 to -- If the ladies want to come off the plane from 15 Midway, go and practice. So they want a secured parking 16 area. Can't blame them. 17 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Yeah. VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: So we said we'll do 18 19 Steve said it's a minimal cost. it. 20 A temporary training facility, the 21 Village will make its existing basketball court that's 22 in Phase 1 available to the Sky for training use 23 commencing on April 20th, 2025 up until the new facility

is ready for occupancy. So once the new facility is



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1 ready, there goes that.

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We did say, though, that their training cannot interfere with our tournaments, you know, because our tournaments are Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

TRUSTEE STOCKS: Right.

TRUSTEE PALLARDY: Right.

VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: That's our money maker. So they had no problem with that.

Utilities and maintenance, that's our responsibility. And then the third -- They haven't seen these provisions, but it's very common, Section 13, they got to give us liability insurance binder, naming us as an additional insured. God for- -- You know, look at that player already from one of the other teams just tore her ligaments and she's out, and she's a very good player. So just say something happens, you know, we don't want to be additional insured. They hold us harmless.

TRUSTEE STOCKS: Okay.

VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: God forbid something happens over there, beyond our control, they can't come after us, you know. They call it the deep pocket theory. The Sky's -- you know, the owners have a lot



more money than we do, but I don't want to be held 1 2. accountable. Operating agreement, all this is, is a 3 memo of understanding. Eventually, we'll need an 4 5 operating agreement by and between us as to very specific terms, hours, and that's almost like a lease --6 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Okay. VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: -- you know. 8 So that 9 will be all covered in this. They brought that up and 10 that's fine. We should have an operating agreement. 11 Default, if they're in default, we're in 12 default, they can take us to court. We can take them to 13 court, and whoever loses pays the attorney fees. And, 14 again, it shouldn't be -- from our prospective, we're 15 going to build the building no matter. We get that 16 money --17 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Right. VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: -- from them. 18 You 19 know, we did our part. 20 TRUSTEE STOCKS: What about naming rights? 21 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: We gave them naming 22 rights. 23 TRUSTEE STOCKS: We gave them naming rights? 24 VILLAGE ATTORNEY GRYCZEWSKI: Yes. So 23 we're going to pick up -- There's a good chance we're 24 going to pick up a health facility there.

They met with Representative Nichols. 4 So we looked him up with -- and they appear to have 5 funding now. I asked Tom to spearhead kind of dialogue 6 with them because Tom knows Jim Tracy, the Laurence coach, very well. He's the vice president of the 8 9 organization and Tom was a basketball coach and probably 10 gave technicals to a lot of the player- -- coaches 11 reffing. So there's a good chance that they'll go in 12 there. They still want a full-blown building along --13 attached to the front of Wintrust, but that is more 14 money than we have now. And plus, they haven't -- they 15 say they have finances but we haven't seen the cash yet. 16 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Well, is a motion in order then? TRUSTEE MALOY: Can I just ask real quick? 17 18 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Sure. 19 TRUSTEE MALOY: So, like, the advertising, is 20 that -- like, what do we spend now in advertising and 21 are we going to --22 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: About 300,000. 23 TRUSTEE MALOY: Okay.
