21 MS. SHEEHAN: I'm going to summarize the Month
22 End Board Report Marilyn prepared for June. Cash the
23 end of June was 90.6 million, that compared with May's
24 ending balance -- cash balance of 88.4 million

1 reflects an increase of 2.2 million for June.

2 General Fund Revenues Year to Date through
3 June were 26.7 million which is exceeding Budget by
4 approximately 8 percent. One of the Revenue Line
5 Items exceeding Budget is the Local Motor Fuel Tax.
6 This is \$644,000 from FedEx in June for their 2020 to
7 2023 taxes. This is additional business that hadn't
8 been estimated with the Year End Budget.

9 Another contributing item is, the Second
10 Quarter Investment Activity was recorded. This
11 reflected \$657,000 of Net Investment Income.

12 General Fund Expenses Year to Date Total,
13 18.3 million. General Fund -- The General Fund has
14 utilized only 39 percent of their Budget so far this
15 year. Overall, the Departments are tracking -- or
16 trending on track or below their Budgets through June.

17 The General Fund Net Revenue Over
18 Expenditures through June was 8.3 million.

19 Page 20, Water Fund. Revenue through June
20 was 19.5 million and Expenses were 18.6 resulting in
21 approximately a 900,000-dollar excess Revenue Over
22 Expenditure.

23 65th and Cicero TIF. \$2.4 million of the
24 TIF's Surplus was returned to the County in June. Of

1 that, approximately \$700,000 was sent back to the
2 Village in August.

3 Let's see. And then finally, the Event
4 Center. The Event Center Revenue for the month of
5 June was 244,000 with \$295,000 of expenses resulting
6 in a Net Operating Deficit of \$51,000. Year to Date,
7 the Event Center has a Net Revenue of \$37,000 which is
8 better than the projected Budget through June.

9 And that summarizes June 2024.

14 total of \$1,254,318.41 in payroll.

15 The grand total of bills, claims and
16 payroll expenses to be approved is \$5,896,594.78.
17 I'd like to request a motion that all bills, claims
18 and payroll expenses are approved as presented.

4 TRUSTEE KENSIK: That's all I have, Mayor.

5 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Trustee Stocks ...

6 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Thank you, Mr. Mayor.

7 Everything relating to the Fire Department
8 is on the consent agenda. I did want to mention that
9 on November 11th, Veterans Day, we are celebrating
10 both veterans as well as first responders and I'll
11 talk to the respective chiefs on that as we get closer
12 to that date.

13 And that's all I have, Mr. Mayor.

14 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Terry, just a
15 thought with that, if you think it will work. We've
16 always got good response from retirees for the
17 Christmas luncheon, but maybe honoring first
18 responders that are retired?

11 going to work a lot of hours.

14 on behalf of Bedford Park.

10 you've been driving by, the construction is moving
11 along. We have about 65 percent of the concrete is
12 all in for the base course. So within the next few
13 weeks here, you'll really start to see the new
14 configuration of the roadway; so in the next coming
15 months, it's still due to be finished by mid November,
16 all final signals and everything else. Thank you for
17 approving the 75th Water Main and the 65th Street
18 Reconstruction. Those are both scheduled to begin
19 hopefully in October. There is a chance that
20 66th Street will get pushed to next season just given
21 when the plants are open for concrete and things like
22 that. That's all I have tonight, Mayor, so thank you.

23 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: I've got you for the
24 (inaudible) first.

1 The Belt yesterday, I talked to Chris
2 Steinway and I talked to him again today. Can we get
3 him just some preliminary drawings on what we
4 envision --

5 MS. HUFF: Yes. I'm struggling with the light
6 pole -- with the pole configuration and making a
7 roadway work, that's why I haven't finalized something
8 for him yet, but I will get him something next week.

9 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. And then
10 Dr. Toullos, you know, we talked about that possible
11 growth behind going to solar panels back there; but he
12 want -- we'll meet next week with him and his staff.

13 MS. HUFF: Yeah, just so I can get a better
14 understanding of what we're looking at and trying to
15 do there.

16 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: We will meet with them
17 and present a plan to Mr. Toullos.

18 MS. HUFF: Thank you.

19 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Mark ...

20 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: Everything is going well.
21 Two people, you know, are on medical, getting
22 treatment, getting better. The painting is ongoing.
23 The last was taken care of at Station One. All
24 projects are wrapping up within the next month and --

1 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Wayne Hansen is going
2 to Florida?

3 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: That's the first I heard.
4 Is he going to be a winter bird or go --

5 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Pardon?

6 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: Is he, like, a winter bird
7 or --

8 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Work, he's going to
9 work.

10 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: Wayne Hansen or Wayne
11 Clark?

12 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: They said Wayne Hansen
13 today.

14 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: Clark owns property down
15 there. I know Wayne Clark owns property down there.

16 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Yeah, I knew Wayne
17 Clark was going to Florida.

18 DEPUTY CHIEF MURRAY: He was planning on going.

19 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Tom, not related
20 to Wayne ...

21 CHIEF HANSEN: No, I have nothing. Just going to
22 get home and watch the start of the Bears Super Bowl
23 season this year.

24 MR. RONOVSKY: Bold prediction on the record.

1 CHIEF HANSEN: On the record.

2 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Back is okay.

3 CHIEF HANSEN: It is what it is. It will get
4 better.

5 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Good.

6 Kevin ...

7 MR. ORMINS: For the Fire and Police info, we're
8 going to start painting the lines on 73rd maybe
9 tomorrow, but possibly all next week. Just traffic,
10 you know -- They move pretty fast, so ...

11 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: And, Alyssa, thanks for
12 getting those pictures.

13 MS. HUFF: Of course.

14 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Extremely helpful.

15 Okay. Rory ...

16 MR. DOSS: I have nothing at the time. Thank
17 you.

18 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Marilyn ...

19 MS. CURNUTTE: I have nothing. Thank you.

20 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Joe ...

21 MR. RONOVSKY: Nothing. Thank you, Mayor.

22 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Do you want to just go
23 over the 11th and 13th because I just touched on
24 the -- 11th and 23rd because I just touched on --

1 MR. RONOVSKY: Yeah. So September 11th, we have
2 the Sky game. Obviously, we've been getting RSVPs in
3 here. The Park District bus is broken down right now
4 and we're getting that in repairs, so we're looking to
5 getting a driver for the Village bus to take a group
6 down here. I can fend for myself. Some people might
7 have to carpool or whatever, but we will try to get
8 the Village bus to take a group down there. We're
9 still working through the details if they're going to,
10 like, call us out pre-game or halftime, in between a
11 break in the quarter just to acknowledge that, you
12 know, we're building this thing with them. And then
13 I'll be able to coordinate tickets with you guys and
14 everything to make it easy for those that are getting
15 down there. But it should be a great night and it's
16 fun and looking forward to meeting all the people and
17 introducing everybody that you've been seeing walking
18 through here. So we'll get that going.

19 And then we're finalizing invites.
20 Tomorrow we'll get those going. We'll have a digital
21 invite and then a card copy if you need people to
22 invite for the groundbreaking which will be on the
23 23rd. It's going to be in the morning and then a 30-,
24 35-minute ceremony that's going to be there. We'll

1 actually break ground on the actual dirt, like, on the
2 walking path area. We're going to set up a big tent
3 in case it's hot so people aren't getting baked in the
4 sun. We'll have some waters out there. We're going
5 to open up the Sports Complex for tours if people want
6 to go through there, but we're going to host a
7 reception at the brand-new Moretti's that's opening
8 across to street to give them new business.

9 TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Do we have a date for the
10 groundbreaking at Moretti's?

11 MS. HUFF: Moretti's officially opens -- they're
12 having a soft opening the 17th and 18th from 5:00 to
13 8 00 p.m. both nights. If you want to do that, you
14 can ask me, I'll get you the contact, it's reservation
15 only for those two nights. Then they're doing a soft
16 opening on the 20th. They'll be open through the next
17 week, but I think it's only dinner time that they'll
18 be open; and then September 26th is their official
19 ribbon cutting. So they will already be in operation,
20 but their official ribbon cutting is scheduled for
21 6:00 p.m.

22 MR. RONOVSKY: And we'll get a picture, we're
23 talking with them, of you guys out in front on the
24 23rd. I'm hoping that everybody is there so we can --

1 two birds, one stone; but we'll still be invited to
2 the 26th, but we're going to have, you know, a pretty
3 big party on the 23rd, so it will be fun.

4 TRUSTEE WESOLOWSKI: Long awaited party for
5 Moretti's.

6 CHIEF HANSEN: Mr. Mayor, just a quick reminder.
7 The Fire Department has two things going on next week.
8 September 10th, they're getting their ISO Class 1
9 plaque that, I think, Chief Johnson invited all the
10 trustees too; and then September 11th at 9:00, they're
11 having a ceremony -- a 9/11 ceremony at 9:00 a.m. just
12 as a reminder to everyone.

13 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: What were the dates
14 again?

15 CHIEF HANSEN: The 10th and the 11th.

16 TRUSTEE STOCKS: Tuesday and Wednesday.

17 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Any other
18 requests?

19 Yvette, do you want to add anything?

20 VILLAGE CLERK ZAVALA: No. Thank you.

21 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: We don't need an
22 Executive Session for once, which is nice, and I think
23 that's it.

24 Can we have a motion and second to adjourn?

1 TRUSTEE PALLARDY: So moved.

2 TRUSTEE MALOY: Second.

3 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. All those in
4 favor?

5 (Chorus of ayes.)

6 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Opposed?

7 (No response.)

8 VILLAGE PRESIDENT BRADY: Okay. Go Kansas City.

9 (Which were all the proceedings
10 had in the above-entitled cause.)
